

RULES FOR HANDLING PARENT PROTESTS

1. All Head Coaches shall inform the parents of their team that:
 - a. WIJARA enforces the USSA Regulations of Alpine Competition including the Code of Conduct; and
 - b. The USSA Code of Conduct also applies to all parents who enroll children in WIJARA.
2. If a parent wishes to protest a decision by a race official, the concerned parent shall first speak with the Head Coach for his team. (Under USSA Regulations only coaches, race officials and team captains are authorized to submit protests.)
3. If the Head Coach decides, after speaking with the concerned parent, to submit a protest, the Head Coach shall do so in the fashion required by the WIJARA Rules of Competition. In this case, a jury will be convened and the protest shall be resolved in accordance with the USSA Regulations and the WIJARA Rules of Competition.
4. If the team Head Coach decides to not submit a protest, the Head Coach shall so advise the concerned parent. The Head Coach shall also advise the concerned parent his decision is final and that any conduct inconsistent with the Head Coaches' decision may be a violation of the USSA Code of Conduct.
5. In the event concerned parent fails to accept the decision of the Head Coach to not submit a protest or in the event the concerned parent engages in any conduct in violation of the USSA Code of Conduct, then the Technical Delegate for that race may, in his discretion, convene a jury and impose the appropriate sanction on either the concerned parent or the team which the concerned parent represents. The sanctions which may be imposed include, but are not limited to, deducting team points and excluding the offending parent from the race area.
